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TWO ESSAYS FROM THE FOLLOWING

B1. Explain the importance of Canterbury in the development of Christianity in the United Kingdom, linking your account to sites within the city.

B2. You are travelling by coach with a group who will be visiting Salisbury Cathedral. Outline the introduction you will give to the Cathedral and your commentary to the point when you arrive at the Cathedral's admissions desk.

B2. You are accompanying a group to Stratford-upon-Avon and will be visiting Holy Trinity Church, Hall's Croft, the Birthplace and Anne Hathaway's Cottage. Outline the introduction you would give to the life of William Shakespeare relating it to these sites.

B4. Outline the commentary you would give to a group on a tour of the **Precincts** of Windsor Castle, starting at the Visitor Centre and ending with their entry into the State Apartments from which point the group will use their acoustiguides. You do not need to include the seven-minute introduction inside St. George's Chapel.
