 - a) The SeaCity Museum
 - b) The Southampton City Art Gallery

- 5** The face of Southampton was utterly changed by World War II, discuss.

- 6** The co-existence of wildlife and nature within a city environment, presents a special challenge to conservators; provide examples of successful and unsuccessful projects in the Southampton area.
