<u>SECTION A</u>

1. In note form, describe the roles of the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs and Aldermen in the City.
2. London is hailed as a major world financial centre. In note form, explain why you think this is so, **and** describe **three** or **four** of the financial institutions that contribute to its importance.
3. In note form, explain how the City Corporation, as a Local Authority, differs from other British Local Authorities.

<u>SECTION B</u>

1. You have been asked to take a group on a short walk illustrating examples of twenty-first-century architecture in the City. Write brief notes on **four** buildings you might consider choosing. (You are not required to plan a detailed route.)
2. You have been commissioned to take a group on a short walk focusing on pre-twenty-first century iconic buildings in the City, covering a wide range of its institutions and activities. Write brief notes on **four** buildings you might want to introduce the group to. (You are not required to plan a detailed route.)
3. You have volunteered to lead a walking tour of City churches, including three internal visits. Write brief notes on the **three** churches you would choose for these, identifying the features to which you would draw the group's attention. At least one of your choices should be a non-Wren church. (You are not required to plan a detailed route, and you may assume that the churches of your choice will be open on the day of your group's tour!)
