**ANSWER THREE QUESTIONS FROM THE FOLLOWING SIX IN NOTE OR
BULLET-POINT FORM
EACH QUESTION CARRIES 25 MARKS.**

1. Describe the main sources of the City Corporation's income and how this income is spent.
2. Describe the principal roles played by the River Thames in the history and development of the City of London from Roman times to the present day.
3. You have been asked to give a talk to your local history society on the diverse customs and traditions of the City of London. Which four or five would you highlight?
4. Explain the past and present roles of the Livery Companies in the City.
5. A company relocating from the West End to Cannon Place over Cannon Street Station has commissioned you to lead a ninety-minute orientation walk around the area for twenty of its employees in order to introduce them to a range of its institutions and activities, both past and present. What four or five key locations would you build your tour around? (You are not required to plan a detailed route.)
6. You have volunteered to lead a walking tour of City churches, including three internal visits. Write brief notes on the **three** churches you would choose for these, identifying the features to which you would draw the group's attention. At least one of your choices should be a non-Wren church. (You are not required to plan a detailed route, and you may assume that the churches of your choice will be open on the day of your group's tour!)
