**a)** Give an account in note form of the development of the English garden from Elizabethan times, making reference to the major design movements of the 18<sup>th</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. Mention the leading personalities in garden design, up to and including the present day.

#### OR:

**b)** Write notes for a brief presentation on **TWO** of the following:

Charles Dickens
Beatrix Potter
JMW Turner
Winston Churchill
Queen Anne

#### OR:

c) Make notes for a presentation on the development of the English language from Anglo Saxon times to the present day. Include references to the influence of the Viking and Norman invasions and give examples of how these affect the English we use today in both its "standard" and regional variations.
